Current Trends in Agronomy for Sustainable Agriculture

9th–13th September 2013, Brno, Czech Republic

Aim and Scope:

The aim of the Summer School is active exchange of knowledge and discussion among all participants on how to best tackle sustainability issues in field production.

How to achieve sustainability in agriculture has become an important issue. Each farm is unique and complex system which includes many components, effects and interactions, therefore this is a challenging topic. A farm is a hierarchical system in which each organizational level is interlinked with the level below and above. Problems often occur at higher organizational levels, such as population, community and ecosystem. It is necessary to deal with these problems at the appropriate level, or at least with regard to the hierarchical relations in the agricultural system.

The target topics of the Summer School are the different comprehensive and systematic approaches to field production and problems solving in the field production as well as the possibilities and methods for sustainability assessment of field production and its optimization.

Summer School should be a meeting of students, researchers and tutors who are involved in different aspects of crop production sustainability, the procedures for the systematic improvement, and the possibilities and methods of its assessment and further use of the results of such evaluations for the optimization of the farming systems. All participants are intended to contribute to the programme of the event by giving a lecture and discussion about presented issues.

Call for Contributions

Besides host and guest lecturers, other registrations will be accepted after assessment of a 1-page abstract of contribution submitted before 7th June 2013. All the contributions delivered during the Summer School as about a 40-minute presentation will be printed in the form of about 10 pages papers in the book of proceedings.
