# The Library Recommends – citation style of Mendel University in Brno

The Library Recommends citation style of Mendel University in Brno was created for the needs of students and academics of the university. The creator of the citation style is the MENDELU Library.

# Basic features of the Library Recommends citation style

- The entry of the author's name is always in inverted order (surname, first name).
  Surnames are written in versals (i.e. capital letters): SURNAME, first name:
- If the source has more than one author, the individual authors are separated in the full bibliographic reference by a semicolon, e.g. KOCUROVÁ, Tamara; HAMPEL, David. In the in-text citation, the surnames of the authors of one source are separated by a comma: (Kocurová, Hampel, 2020).
- If a source has one to three authors, all authors are listed. In the case of four or more authors, only the name of the first author is entered and the abbreviation "et al." is added.<sup>1</sup>
- The last author listed in the bibliographic reference is followed by a period as a separator and the year of publication of the cited source.
- For in-text citation the so-called Harvard method is used, where the author's surname and the year of publication of the cited source are written in round brackets.
- The title of the cited source is in italics (in the case of citing a chapter in a book, the title of the book is in italics, not the chapter; in the case of an article, the title of the journal is in italics, not the article).
- When citing a journal article the details are given in the following format: year(number), range of pages. The range of pages is written without the abbreviation "p".
- The DOI is written in the form of a complete URL link including the prefix https://doi.org/.

# In-text citation – the Harvard method

When referencing in the text (in-text citation), the so-called Harvard method (author-date) is used, i.e. the author's surname and year of publication are in round brackets, e.g. (Klaban, 2011). Unlike a full bibliographic reference in a reference list, the author's surname is written in regular type, not in versal. In addition to the surname and year of publication, direct quotations should also include the page or range of pages on which the quoted idea is presented. In the case of indirect quotations (paraphrases) it is not always necessary to indicate the pages, but it is often appropriate because it makes it easier to trace the cited idea in larger units.

If the author's name appears in the text, only the year of publication and the page or range of pages cited are given in brackets. If multiple sources are cited within a single round brackets, they are separated by a semicolon, e.g. (Gliessman, 2015; Vandermeer, Perfecto, 2018). Surnames of authors of one work are separated by a comma: (Vandermeer, Perfecto, 2018).

# **Elements of bibliographic reference**

# **Author**

- The name of the author is given in the format: SURNAME, first name. The surname of the author is written in versals (capital letters). If the cited source has multiple authors, they are separated by semicolons: SURNAME, name; SURNAME, name; SURNAME, name.
- A full stop is used as a separator after the last cited author, followed by the year of publication of the cited work.
- The names of all authors shall be included up to the number of three. In the case of four or more authors, only the first author is listed, followed by the abbreviation "et al.".
- In the references in the text, only the author's surname is given besides the year of publication -; capital letters are not used here. If a source has multiple authors, it is separated by a comma: (Surname, Surname, Year). The rule of four or more authors applies here as well.
- The entry of the first name follows the source cited. If the author's first name is spelled out in the source, it is written in the same (i.e. spelled out) form in the bibliographic reference. If the author has an abbreviated first name in the document, i.e. only an initial, it is written in this form in the bibliographic reference. The full form of the first name is not traceable in other sources.

- The position of author may include not only the author but also the editor (typically in the case of collections).
  - The abbreviation "(ed.)" is added after the editor's name in round brackets. When citing English-language sources, a distinction is made between singular and plural if there are multiple editors, the abbreviation "(eds.)" is given.
- The author of the work may not only be a person, but also a corporation (organization). In such a case, the name of the organisation, e.g. MENDEL UNIVERSITY IN BRNO, is given in the citation in the position of the author.
- If the cited source does not have an author, the author is omitted from the bibliographic reference and the title of the work is placed at the beginning of the citation, followed by the year of publication. The abbreviated title and year of publication shall be used in the reference in the text. If the cited source explicitly identifies the author as anonymous, etc., the abbreviation "Anon." is used in place of the author's name in the citation.

#### Year

- The year of publication of the cited source is given in the bibliographic reference after the names of the authors of the work.
- If the year of publication is obviously incorrect, the correction is given in square brackets: [2001].
- If the year of publication is not given in the cited source, it can be found in other sources or estimated; it is then also given in square brackets in the citation.
- If the year of publication is not given in the cited source or cannot be found in other sources, the abbreviation "s. a." is used instead of the year of publication in square brackets: [s. a.].<sup>2</sup>

### Title

- The full title including any subtitle shall be given.
- The subtitle is written in the form: Title: Capitalized subtitle.
- The title and subtitle shall be in italics. If a book chapter or a paper in a collection is cited, the title of the chapter or paper is not italicized, but the title of the entire book or collection or the title of the parent document. Similarly, when citing a journal article, the title of the journal will be italicized, not the title of the article.

# Place of publication

The place of publication shall be entered as indicated in the source cited.

- If it is a lesser-known city or a name that refers to more than one place, additional information in the form of the state, province, region, etc., is given in round brackets: e.g. London (Ontario).
- In the case of multiple places of publication, only the first or most important of these is given, or in the case of a source with multiple publishers the one belonging to the publisher cited.

# **Publisher**

- The place of publication and the publisher are separated by a colon: Place of publication Publisher
- Publisher means the organisation or person responsible for publishing the resource.
- If the source has more than one publisher, only one of them is indicated. In the case of multiple publishers, care should be taken to ensure that the ISBN given in the citation corresponds to the publisher cited.

## Volume and number

• It is given in the case of citations of journal articles or citations of an entire issue of a journal. The year is given first, followed by the journal number in round brackets; there is no space between the year and the number bracket: year(number).

# Range of pages

- The range of pages is given in the citation of the article, book chapter or paper in the conference proceedings.
- No abbreviation is used before the number of pages neither the Czech "s." nor the English "p".

# **Identifier**

# **ISBN/eISBN (International Standard Book Number)**

- A unique book identifier that allows unambiguous tracking of the cited source.
- Different editions and different formats (hardback, paperback, etc.) of the same title have different ISBNs.
- Electronic books are assigned an eISBN, which can also be found under alternative designations: "ISBN (online)", "ISBN (ebook)", etc.

# **ISSN/eISSN (International Standard Serial Number)**

- Unique identifier of periodical publications, which allows unambiguous tracking of the cited periodical.
- Electronic journals are assigned an eISBN, which can also be found under alternative designations: "ISSN (online)", "online ISSN", etc.

# **DOI (Digital Object Identifier)**

- A unique and permanent identifier of a digital object that is accessible via digital networks (in layman's terms, the Internet). This identifier is usually found in e-articles, e-books, e-learning publications, online images, tables, data, etc.
- The DOI is written in its full form as a URL link including the prefix https://doi.org/, for example https://doi.org/10.1079/9781786394811.0177.
- If the cited source has a DOI, this is given priority over other available URLs.

# Access to electronic resources

- When referencing electronic resources, the DOI is preferably used in the form of a URL link including the prefix https://doi.org/.
- If the source does not have a DOI, another available URL should be used, but it should not contain search queries<sup>3</sup> or unnecessary elements such as the language designation. The goal is to provide a URL that allows others to access the cited content repeatedly. This is why links to internal, non-publicly accessible repositories that require login (authentication) are generally not provided.

# **Types of sources**

In addition to the general principles of citation style described above, the type of source cited also influences the final form of the bibliographic reference. In other words, different information is used when creating a bibliographic reference for a book and different information is used when citing a law. The following section therefore provides diagrams and examples of citations for each type of source. Mandatory data are highlighted in bold, optional data are shown without highlighting.<sup>4</sup>

#### Book in e-reader format

Bibliographic citations for books in e-reader format are created in a similar way as for printed books, except that the title of the book is followed by the format of the book, e.g. [Kindle ebook]. These book formats usually lack pagination; therefore, when referring to a specific segment of an e-book, other available divisions are used: chapter or section number, paragraph number, etc.

# **Online First / Article in Press**

This is an article that has not yet been included in a specific year and issue of the journal, but has already been published on the journal's website in an "online first" version or as an "article in press". These articles are missing some mandatory data: the year and number of the journal and the number of pages. The [online first] flag is used in the bibliographic reference for this type of article. After the finalisation of the publication process, the article will be included in a specific issue of the journal, so its bibliographic reference will change. Due to the variability of data over time, the date of citation is given for this type of document.

# Overview of the main changes in citation style: Comparison of version 3 and version 2.1

# **Elements of bibliographic reference**

#### **Author**

- A procedure has been added for situations where the cited source has no author: the author is omitted from the citation and the citation starts with the title of the work. If the author is explicitly identified as "anonymous", etc. in the cited document, the author position in the citation is "Anon.".
- When citing English sources, the English abbreviation "eds." is used to indicate editors in the plural.

## Year of publication

- The copyright entry for the year of publication is removed.
- If the year of publication of the cited document cannot be traced, the Latin abbreviation "s. a." in square brackets (a change from the abbreviation "b. r." used in the previous version).

#### **Edition and versions**

- For books, the obligation to indicate the edition is abolished (individual editions of a publication have different ISBNs, so they can be safely distinguished by this information).
- For some types of resources (especially software), the version or release is indicated.

#### Volume and number

The year of the journal is not in bold but in normal font without highlighting.

### Range of pages

The use of abbreviations for page ranges is deleted. Thus, the method of recording cited pages for all types of sources - articles, chapters in books and contributions in collections - is unified to a notation without abbreviations: e.g. 46-85.

#### **Citation date**

- The date of citation is indicated especially for dynamic sources (web pages, etc.).
- For some types of e-resources, the obligation to indicate the date of citation is abolished, specifically for: e-books and chapters in e-books, e-journals and articles in e-journals, contributions in electronic collections.
- If the citation date is given, it is always written just before the URL. It is separated from the URL by a period. The format of the citation date [citation yyyy-mm-dd] remains the same.

#### Other changes (electronic resources)

- Citation of the medium specification [online] in citations of electronic resources is abolished.
- The phrase "Available from:" is also removed from citations of electronic resources, leaving only the URL without the verbal quotation.
- For some types of electronic resources, the obligation to indicate the date of citation is removed (see above).

# Selected changes by source type

Only changes related to the most frequently cited types of sources are listed.

#### **Book**

- No edition is given.
- The edition is optional.

#### E-book available online

- The following elements are removed from the citation: media specification [online]; publication date; citation date; the phrase "Available from:".
- The edition is optional.

#### **Book chapter**

The indication of the issue is removed; the range of pages is written without the abbreviation "s.".

#### E-book chapter

- The following elements are removed from the citation: media specification [online]; publication date; citation date; the phrase "Available from:".
- The range of pages is written without the abbreviation "s".

# **Journal**

The year is not in bold but in plain type.

#### **Electronic journal**

- The following elements are removed from the citation: media specification [online]; citation date; the phrase "Available from:".
- The year is not in bold but in plain type.

#### Journal article

The year is not in bold but in plain type.

#### **Electronic journal article**

- The following elements are removed from the citation: media specification [online]; citation date; the phrase "Available from:".
- The year is not in bold but in plain type.

#### Paper in conference proceedings

The range of pages is written without the abbreviation "p".

# Paper in electronic conference proceedings

- The following elements are removed from the citation: media specification [online]; citation date; the phrase "Available from:".
- The range of pages is written without the abbreviation "p".

# **Research report**

- Removed from the citation the reference to the commissioner of the research report.
- If an electronic version of the document is cited, the date of citation and the URL shall be included in the citation.

#### Thesis or dissertation

- The designation of this type of resource is changed from the original "thesis" to "thesis or dissertation".
- In the case of citation of the electronic version of the qualification thesis, the date of citation and the URL address are given.

#### **Software**

- The designation of this type of resource is changing from the original "computer program" to "software".
- An optional indication of the software publisher is introduced in the citation but only if the publisher is different from the creator.
- The phrase "Available from:" is removed from the citation.

#### **Cartographic documents**

A template for citing online maps has been added.

# Legislation

- The designation of this type of resource is changed from the original "legislative documents" to "legislation".
- The scheme for citing legal regulations published in the Collection of Laws of the Czech Republic has been modified; a new model for citing other legal regulations published outside the Collection of Laws has been added.

#### **Archival documents and manuscripts**

A template for citing online archival documents has been added.

#### Website

The way of citing the website and the secondary website has been unified - the citation of both sources is regulated within one chapter called "Website, web page". The secondary website is cited in the same way as the website.

- The following information is removed from the citation of the website and web page: primary responsibility for the creation of the website in the position of the creator, the designation of the medium [online], the indication of the update/revision date after the publisher, the phrase "Available from:". The indication of the website publisher remains in the citation.
- Post on website: remove from the citation the media specification [online], the date of update and the phrase "Available from:".

### **Data files**

A new scheme for citing this type of source has been added to the handbook.

# Multiple vs Single Target Vegetable Exposure to Increase Young Children's Vegetable Intake

**Objective:** To evaluate the effectiveness of repeated exposure to multiple vs single target vegeta increasing young children's vegetable intake.

Methods: A pilot randomized controlled trial (children aged 4–6 years, n = 32) was conducted, exposed children at home 15 times over 5 weeks to either 1 (single target) or 3 (multiple target) vegatives A comparison group did not change eating habits. Vegetable intake was measured by (1) a dinner measured at research facilities, (2) 3-day weighed food records, and (3) usual vegetable intake (parent research facilities, (2) 3-day weighed food records, and (3) usual vegetable intake (parent research facilities) and either immediately after intervention (1), at 3-month follow-up (3) or both (2).

Results: There were no differences between groups at baseline in vegetable intake. Usual vegetable intake increased in the multiple target group from .6 to 1.2 servings/d and did not change in other groups (P = .02). Food record data were not significant but underpowered. Vegetable intake from dinner meals was not significantly different between groups.

Conclusions and Implications: Exposure to multiple vegetables simultaneously may be more effective than a single vegetable to increase young children's intake. Larger scale research is recommended to confirm the effectiveness of offering variety in exposure and to enhance the understanding of the mechanisms involved.

### INTRODUCTION

Low acceptance is a key reason for low vegetable intake in children. 
Vegetables are less sweet and more bitter than most foods. 
These properties predispose to low acceptance because of innate likes and dislikes. 
However, food preferences are largely learned, with childhood being a critical phase. 
Dislike is a main reason why parents stop offering or not serving their children certain foods, 
which may indicate that parents are unaware of the plasticity of food preferences, although other factors also

play a role including not wanting to waste food or money. A heightened food neophobia between the ages of 3 and 6 years amplifies food avoidance and may add to parental anxiety around a child's refusal to consume vegetables.

High vegetable consumption is associated with a lower risk of chronic disease and mortality. Australian guidelines recommended 2 servings/d of vegetables for 4- to 7-year-old children, which were recently increased to 4.5 servings/d for children aged 4–8 years (a serving representing 75 g of vegetables including potatoes), 9,10

whereas actual vegetable intake in this age group is 1.2 servings.11 Repeated exposure is a well-recognized method to increase vegetable acceptance and intake of children in their peak of food neophobia. 12 This technique is based on the theoretical framework of mere exposure, which is the observation that repeated exposure to a stimulus by itself increases affective evaluations of that stimulus.13 Most studies with children in their peak of food neophobia used single vegetables as a target for exposure and found increases in the intake of the particular vegetables studied. 12 Multiple vegetable exposure has been less studied, 14,15 and results were inconclusive, with 1 study finding no effect 14 and the other a positive <sup>1</sup> nowledge, so
