

Author Identifiers

Author identifiers ensure that your work is clearly attributed to you and it easy for others (grant funders, other researchers etc.) to find your research output.

Your publications will be searchable by your name, regardless of the used version of the name and regardless of other authors whose name is identical to yours.

You should write **affiliation in English: University-Faculty-Department**.

For example: *Mendel University in Brno, Faculty of AgriSciences, Department of Food Technology*.

ORCID (Open Researcher and ContributorID)

ORCID ID form: 0000-0002-3216-1074

ORCID is international non-profit, which aims to create a central registry of unique author identifiers. ORCID links between different author ID schemes, such as ResearcherID or Scopus Author ID.

Some publishers (for example: Wiley & Sons) put in full texts of articles ORCID identifier with the authors name:



The authors may register for an ORCID identifier at <http://orcid.org> (see [article](#)). Registration is free of charge.

Set visibility:



Visibility settings: We strongly recommend choosing **Everyone** or Trusted Parties as this will enable your information to be shared with the systems you interact with.

ResearcherID

ResearcherID form: I-8213-2016

ResearcherID is from April 2019 on Publons, a new environment, where you can add your publications, track your citations, and manage your Web of Science record.

ResearcherID is for those researchers, whose publications are listed in [Web of Science](#).
Author must have at least one publication in Web of Science database in order to have ResearcherID.

You can [log](#) in from platform [Web of Science](#) or from the [Publons](#). Author must create his identifier on his own. **If you already have a ResearcherID** (you can check at Publons.com – Browse) **do not create a new one.**

In "Alternative Publishing Names" you should write your different versions of your name (without or with diacritics, maiden name etc.) in a form: J. Novak, J. Novák, Jan Novák.

In "Institutions" you should write **affiliation in English: University -Faculty- Department**.
For example: *Mendel University in Brno, Faculty of AgriSciences, Department of Food Technology.*

Scopus Author ID

Author ID form: 7801566909

Scopus (from Elsevier company) uses Scopus Author ID, it is created automatically, when there is at least one publication in Scopus database.

Publications are linked to the authors name automatically, due to the various forms of authors name one author can have more Scopus Author ID. In this case you can ask for merging the profiles: see [article](#).
